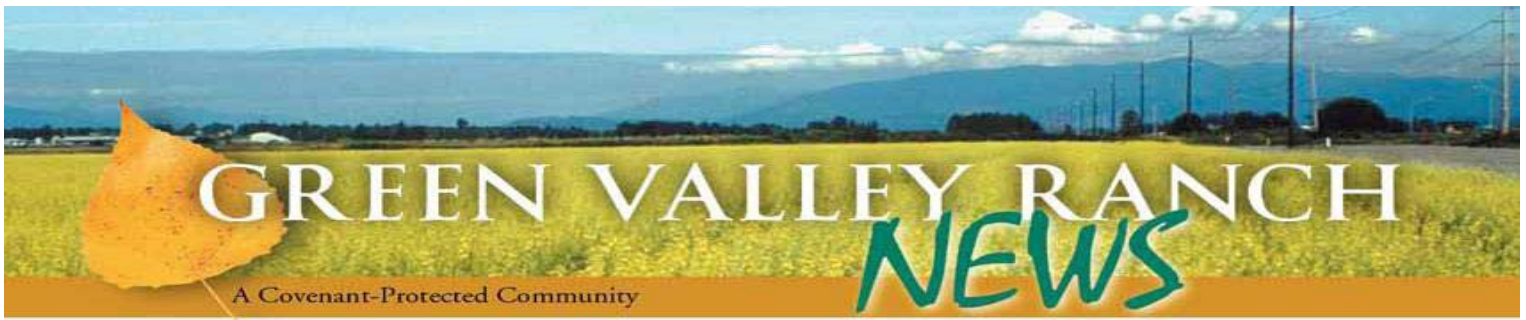
At their meeting on January 22, 2014 the Board of Directors approved a change on how paint colors will be selected in the community. The biggest change is that there will be one color palette for the entire community; no longer will paint colors be selected by neighborhood. # Peggy Ponders

Spring is around the corner, and it's time to start planning! Improvements to your home, landscaping you want to work on, all sorts of things! If only we knew how much water we will be able to use!

As you may remember, the last two summers the only landscape enforcement the Association has been able to do is weeds, due to the watering restrictions that were put in place by Denver Water. Per state law, we were prohibited from sending any violation that required water to cure. This included dry grass, bare areas in the grass or a fully bare yard.

Unfortunately, it will still be a month or so before the restrictions for summer 2014 will be decided. Although there was a record amount of rain the later part of the last summer, Denver Water is still waiting for snowfall in February & March of 2014 to see where their reservoir levels will end up. At that point, they will let the community know what the plan for the summer is.

So what does that mean for the Association? State law says that after a time of drought an Association must give homeowners a 'reasonable amount of time' to bring their yard into compliance before any violations can be sent. However, it does not specify what a 'reasonable amount of time' means.

At the December 9, 2013 Board meeting, the Board discussed what their definition of a reasonable amount of time will mean for Green Valley Ranch. In deciding this, they looked at when landscaping season typically starts in Colorado (March/April), the resources included in fixing some of the yards and how long it may take to bring a yard into compliance if it is seeded, etc.

The Board voted that IF the drought is lifted this year, homeowners in Green Valley Ranch will need to keep the following dates in mind:

**July 1, 2014:** This is the date by which yards will have to show significant improvement toward being in compliance with the rules of the Association. So, yards that were completely dead/dirt last year will have to show seed/sod or xeriscaping in progress.

**September 30, 2014:** This is the date by which all yards will need to be in compliance with the rules of the Association. This includes any bare areas filled in, dead/dirt yards with either grass or xeriscaped, and weeds all removed from the yard.

If you have any questions regarding this, or what it would take to have your property in compliance, please do not hesitate to call!

## What about the backyards?

As you know, the HOA has staff that does inspections on a daily basis, looking to make sure that front yards are kept in compliance. But many homeowners are looking at a lot of violations in back yards, wondering why the Association is not addressing those! The simple reality is that if we can't see a violation; we can't send a letter about it. So what can we do?

The simple solution is to contact the Association and set up an appointment with the Inspectors. We can then take a picture of your neighbor's backyard, from your backyard and send them a violation.



# Teri's Tidbits

Keeping pet waste off the ground is an important responsibility held by all pet owners. If not addressed, the presence of unattended waste can quickly become a major point of conflict amongst neighbors. In fact, it happens to be the single-most talked about problem in homeowner associations across the county. Keeping pet waste off the ground is not just about being considerate to your neighbors and their lawns-It's also about protecting the environment, your family and our community.

Dog waste is more than just a gross and unsightly mess. In 1991, it was labeled a non-point source pollutant by the Environmental Protection Agency, placing it in the same category as herbicides and insecticides, oil, grease and toxic chemicals; and acid drainage from abandoned mines. According to the EPA, two or three days worth of droppings from a population of about 100 dogs can contribute enough bacteria to temporarily close a bay and all watershed areas within 20 miles to swimming and shell fishing. Unattended waste can also harm your health. While many of us don't realize it, dog waste often carries bacteria, worms and other parasites that can be transmitted directly to humans and make them sick. Ringworm, roundworm, salmonella and giardia are examples of such bacteria, all of which are found in dog feces and are easily transferable upon contact. Roundworm, for example, is one of the most common parasites found in dog droppings and it can remain infectious in contaminated soil and water for years.

In order to curb pet waste problems, many areas are now enforcing "pooper scooper" ordinances in which failing to clean up after a dog can carry a hefty fine. Most laws are similar-No person owning, keeping, or having custody of a dog, except a seeing eye dog, shall allow or permit the dog to defecate or urinate on public parking or any sidewalk and each such person shall immediately remove dog excrement from any curb, gutter, alley, landscaping or street. (Washington, DC "Pooper Scooper" Law)

Please be mindful of your front and back yards as well. We all have the right to enjoy your yards and smell the fresh outdoor air, but it makes it hard when all we smell is doggie poop coming from our neighbor's property. Don't let doggie doody get our community down. Be considerate and scoop that poop.

## **3.54E - Weeds.**

All areas must be kept weed free, including, but not limited to, rock and mulch areas, turf areas, sidewalks and driveways. Cutting/mowing weeds is not sufficient to be in compliance; the weeds must be removed. After applying weed killer, dead weeds must be removed.

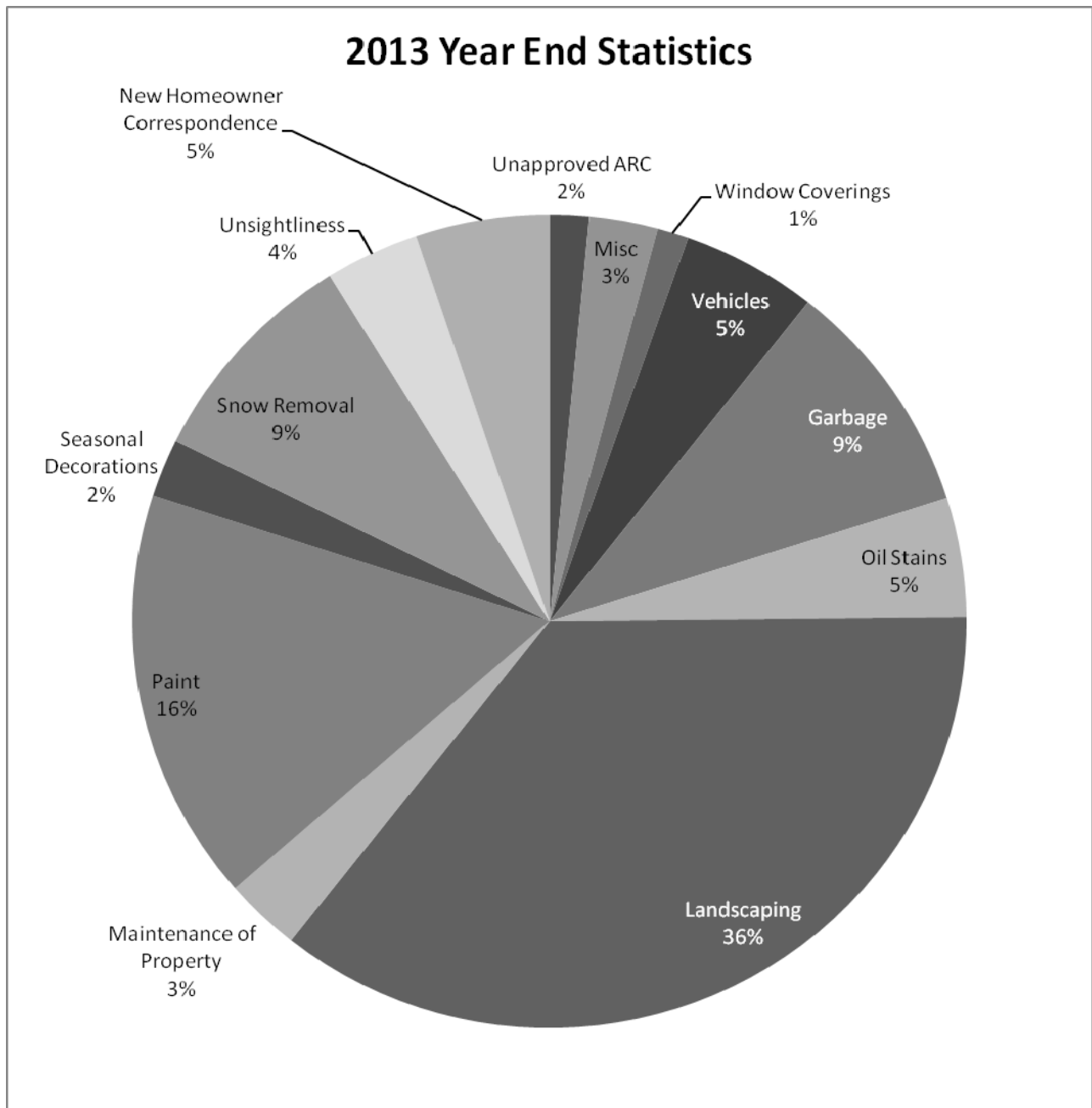

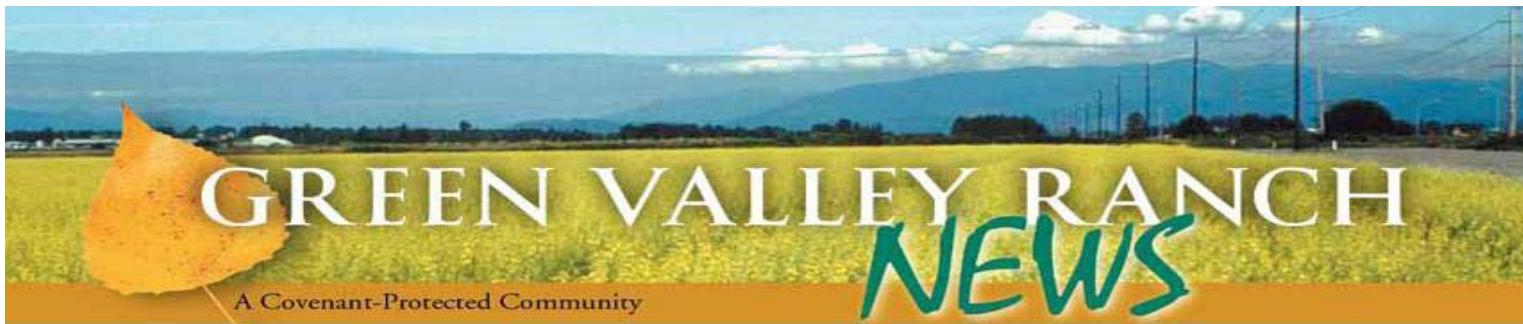
